#### Windows 7 and Ezitree

#### Today's Topics

Today we will start the session with an informal question and answer time. This is your opportunity to ask for anything in Ezitree to be explained, because if I don't know the answer, nobody will. If the questions dry up, there will be a demonstration on how to get a list of persons in a cemetery. You may find this useful if you are planning a visit to a local burying ground where you may expect to find monuments relating to your ancestors. I will then be going through each of the family history charts and giving an explanation of each of them.

**Remember: the user group is your opportunity to ask any questions and get explanations, so please make good use it.**

## The Ezitree 'How To...' How to Get a List of Burials for a Cemetery.

If you were planning to visit a cemetery to check out the headstones of your ancestors, wouldn't it be nice if you had a list of your people who were buried there? Obviously, this does require that you have entered this information into Ezitree from death certificates or other cemetery records. Today's tip will explain how to get this cemetery list.

The first thing to do is to open the 'Find Basic' Search window from the Menu option by clicking 'Find' and then 'Basic.'

This window allows you to search your data by specific criteria, in this case the event type and place name. Since you are looking for burials, type in '009' (the code for a burial event) or click the [Event...] button to open up the 'Select an Event Code' window and then scroll through the list to find the burial event.

Now you need to type in the name of the cemetery and in this example, the word KEMPSEY has been entered. Once you click the [Find] button, the search is commenced and if any records are located they are displayed in the 'Find Basic Data Results' window.

In the above list, 16 burial records for Kempsey have been located.

However, it is known there are at least two cemeteries in Kempsey, East and West so to get the records for EAST KEMPSEY, it needs to be entered as the search criteria in the Place Name field.

The new search criterion has now located 163 records for East Kempsey which is a great result. But what about those records with the burial record place of KEMPSEY in our original search? They will not be included because this type of search only returns records **starting with** the search criteria.

To include **all** the burial records for KEMPSEY, you need to use wild cards in the search. A *wild card* is a symbol that stands for one or more unspecified characters and the two most commonly used are the asterisk (\*) and question mark (?). The asterisk is more commonly used and defines that any number of unspecified characters can occur, where as the question mark is used to replace one unspecified character.

The search will now be done with an asterisk *wild card* on either side of the word KEMPSEY which will return any burial record where the word KEMPSEY occurs anywhere in the place field, the beginning, middle or end.

This has now returned 282 records and if you look closely you will see a number of different place names have been located covering all cemeteries in the Kempsey area.

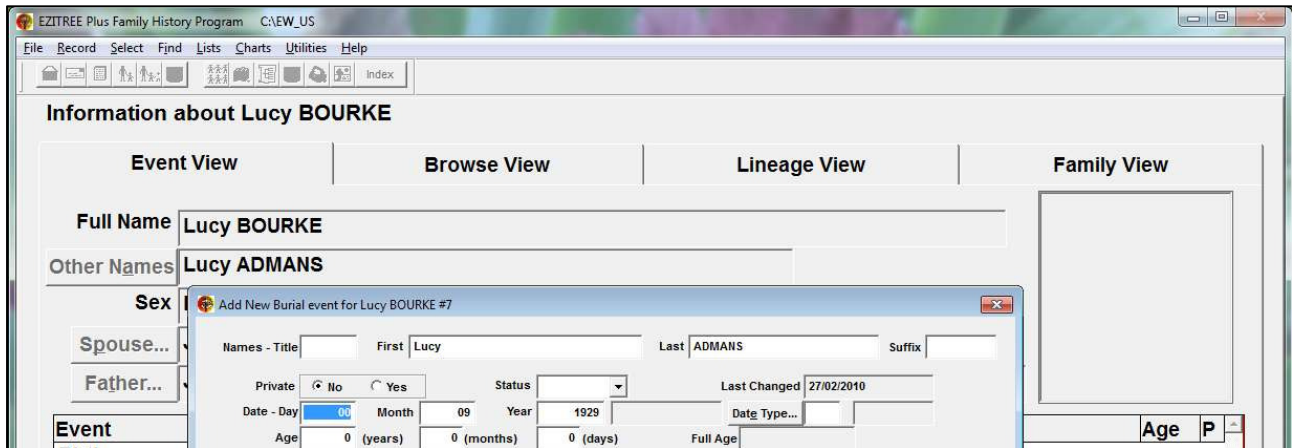
Remember that you can use the 'Sequence' radio buttons to change the order of display of the records between, Last and First Names, First and Last Names, Year of burial Last and First Names, and Record Number. However, for the purposes of providing a cemetery listing the Last and First Names sequence will be the most suitable.

## Married Women's Name Issue

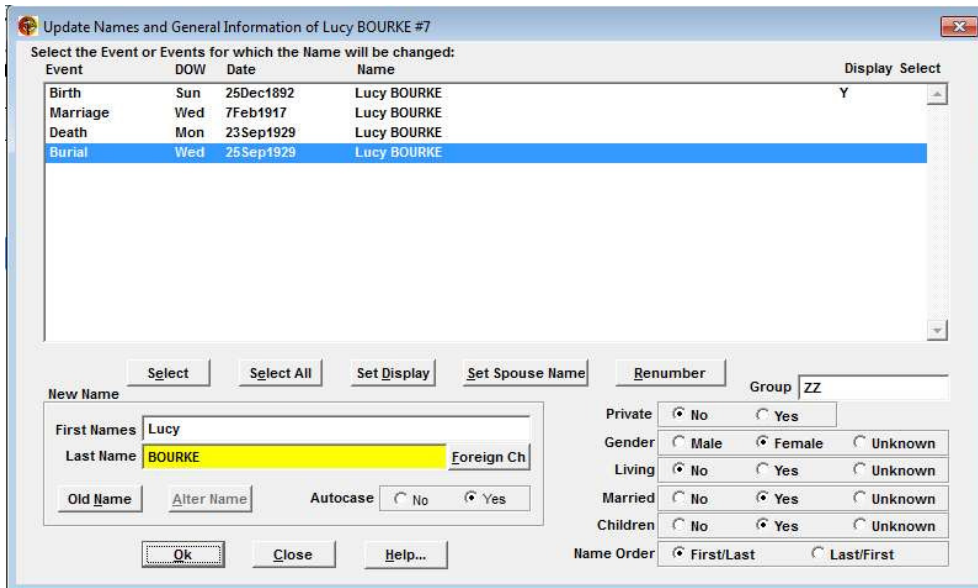
Ezitree has always had the ability to set the name of the person at the date of the event, for example the name of a woman when she died which is usually her husband's family name. This is the best approach to finding people at a location based on their names, such as a person buried in a particular cemetery.

With Ezitree, when you create a burial event for a married woman, the Last Name field will always default to the family name of the man to whom she was last married (in case there was more than one marriage).

In the image below you can see that a new burial event is being created. The woman born as Lucy Bourke who married James Admans has her Last Name recorded as Admans and not Bourke. However, if this is not the case – perhaps she changed her name back to that of her maiden name – you can alter the Last Name to whatever. Ezitree has not limits in this area.



If you have not set the correct name for a married woman, you can do so in the 'Names and General Information' window in Ezitree. This is opened from the menu option 'Record' then 'Names'.



In the example of Lucy Bourke at left, you can see that her family name on all events is shown as 'Bourke', whereas her death and burial events most likely should show that of her husband's family name, 'Admans.'

To set the names of Lucy Bourke, just click the [Set Spouse Name] button. Ezitree will check out all the names and attempt to set the correct family name as shown below.

This process will work best if dates or at least a year is shown on all events. Remember that dates are not absolute and just because you don't know a date doesn't mean you should not enter it. You can always use the 'circa' Date Type in Ezitree to indicate the entered date is approximate.
