User Group Meetings for 2011

The proposed Ezitree meeting dates for 2011 as shown in last week's email are repeated as follows:

26th March (State Election Day)	24th September

Family Search Beta

Don't forget to visit this web site regularly at <https://beta.familysearch.org/> as they are continually adding new records. Over the past twelve months, they have added 160 million records, mainly USA and Europe but a very good place to perhaps find records such as Manchester Parish Registers, 1813 to 1925 (Eastman's Online Genealogy Newsletter).

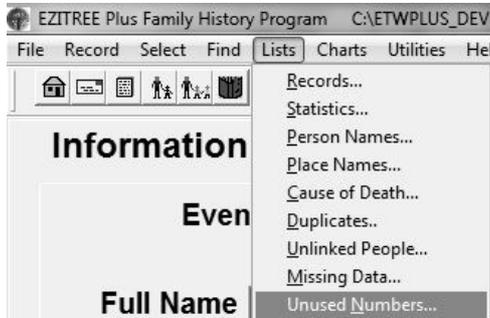

Locate and utilize of Record Numbers not in use.

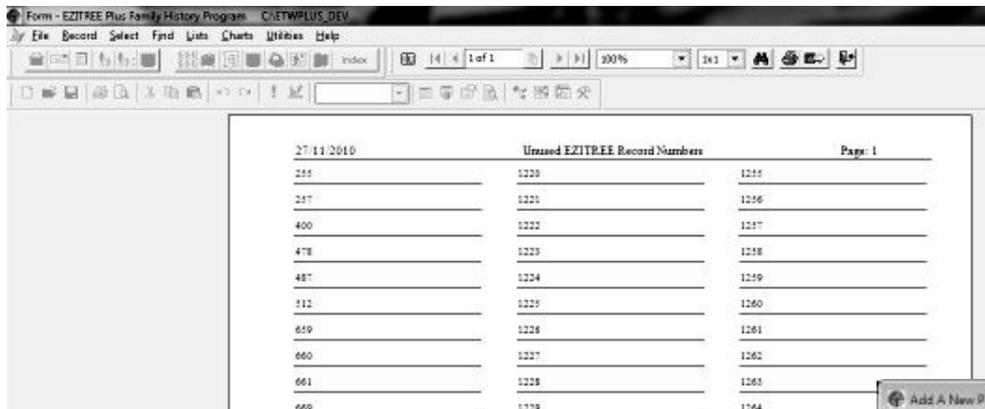
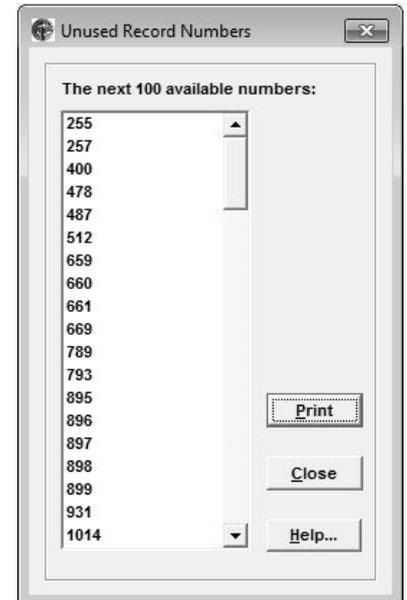
Finding Record Number 'Gaps'

Record numbers are automatically allocated by Ezitree which selects the next highest number in the file. If the highest number in use is say '524' then adding a new person, spouse, child, etc, will result in their record number being '525'. Normally, this means that every record number will be used in sequence, however deleting records or entering a number much higher than the last number in use will create 'gaps'.



You can see these gaps by viewing the 'Unused record Numbers' screen from the 'Lists' menu item. The first one hundred numbers not in use from number '1' will be shown in the list.

You may print this list by clicking the [Print] button. The following list will be created where you can record names, if required.



Adding a Record with a Specific Record Number

To add a new person and assign a specific record number, click the [New...] button from the main window. The 'Add A New Person' window will be opened as shown.

The default action of Ezitree is to assign the next record number higher than the last record number in the file. However, this field is editable which means you may overwrite the default number with any other number, such as one from the 'Unused Record Numbers' list shown above. Ezitree will advise you if the entered number is already in use. Also, leading zeroes are not required. However, it is recommended you do not enter any number higher than '99,000,000' otherwise the program may not be able to add the new record.



You can also get Ezitree to automatically find the lowest 'unused' number just simply clicking the [Select Next] button. This will cause the program to start a search from the beginning of the file until it finds a 'gap' in the numbers and will insert the first unused number it finds. In the following example, the record number '00012154' has been defaulted but when the [Select Next] button is clicked, the number '00000255' is inserted.



Whilst record numbers are the main linking mechanism in Ezitree, it is better not to be too worried about unused numbers. There is no benefit from filling the 'gaps' and record numbers are best left in the background.
