Recent News:

Ancestry.com.au

For those with Tasmanian connections, a new set of records titled 'Reports of Crime 1861-1883' may be useful. These records are similar to the New South Wales Police Gazettes and the index includes victims as well as perpetrators and missing persons. The other recent set of records titled 'Medical Directories 1883-1915' may not be so useful unless you are seeking a legally qualified physician, etc. The information on these can be quite detailed from the place of qualification through the various establishments they served, to others that only have their name, address and area of medical experience. .

Find My Past (FMP)

The **1939 Register** has been out for a while now. It is a good alternative to the lost 1931 Census and the 1941 census which was never taken because of the Second World War. It has the names of some 40 million people in Britain and Wales. There is also an equivalent Register for Scotland and Northern Ireland although not available through FMP. The best thing about the 1939 Register is the recording of Dates of Birth, however quite a stir has been caused in the family history community because even current subscribers to FMP still have to pay to look at this important record set.

FamilySearch.org

Recently released records (23rd November 2015) include 'Tasmania, Miscellaneous Records, 1829-1961'. Out of curiosity, a search of Jeremiah Toomey turned up a prison record with the wonderfully clear photograph as shown (he is not ours!). There are 297,826 images in this collection that covers cemetery records, records from correctional institutions, court records, emigration & immigration records, hospital records, inquest files, military records, and occupational & guild records.



National Library News - Trove

The National Library is still digitising Australian Newspapers and new editions appear regularly. Remember that some newspapers have gaps especially in the early years.
